## Kids Voting Election Day Procedures

1. Parents or another adult must accompany children in grades 3-6 while they vote. Students in grades 6-9 may vote on their own.
2. Please conduct yourself in a quiet and orderly manner. You may have to wait in line for your turn to vote.
3. The first judge will ask you to sign your name, school and grade on the Kids Voting Register. If you remember to bring your voter registration card, you may show it to this first judge.
4. The second judge will mark your school and grade on your Kids Voting Ballot and show you where to vote on the front and back side.
5. Proceed to the voting booth to cast your ballot. You may vote for as many races as you are comfortable. You may ask for help from your parents or one of the Kids Voting judges.
6. After you have voted, place your ballot in the ballot box. Do not fold your ballot. A judge will give you an "I voted" sticker. Congratulations! You have just exercised one of our most valued rights – the right to vote!
7. When you accompany your parent to the adult voting section, please remember to conduct yourself in a quiet and orderly manner.
